The Crustacean Society (TCS) Mid-Year Meeting 2019 will be held from **May 26-30, 2019** at **The Chinese University of Hong Kong**.

TCS Mid-Year Meetings are one of the largest annual gatherings for crustacean biologists around the world, presenting the latest crustacean research in fields including behavior, ecology, genetics and genomics, phylogeny and taxonomy, as well as reproductive biology. The conference brings together leading scientists, promoting the exchange of ideas and collaborations, and also presents a great opportunity for young researchers to increase their exposure and to present their own research.

Guidelines for Symposium Proposals

A symposium should involve several presenters organised around a topic of interest to crustacean research, with one or more invited speakers. The applicant will act as chairperson of the symposium.

The following information must be included in the symposium proposal:

1. Chairperson's first and last name
2. Chairperson's email contact
3. Chairperson's affiliations
4. Title of the proposed symposium
5. Symposium description (100-250 words)
6. List of invited speakers

Symposium applicants will be informed after the deadline for symposium proposals if their proposals are accepted.

Symposium information will be promoted through the TCS2019 website in October 2018.

Symposium titles will be listed among presentation topics in the oral abstract submission webpage for TCS 2019 and the symposium chairperson can decide on the presentations to be included in their symposium.

Guidelines for Workshop Proposals

Workshops can cover any topics of relevance to the community of crustacean research. Applicants will act as the facilitator for the workshop.

The following information must be included in the workshop proposal:

1. Workshop facilitator's first and last name
2. Workshop facilitator's email contact
3. Workshop facilitator's affiliations
4. Please provide a brief bio of the facilitator
5. Title of the proposed Workshop
6. Workshop description (100-250 words)
7. Intended outcomes for participants of the workshop

Workshop facilitators will be informed after the deadline for workshop proposals if their proposals are accepted.

Workshops will be promoted through the TCS2019 website in October 2018, and participants can sign up to the workshop through the registration page when registrations open in January 2019.
